

Personalpronomen

Von den englischen Personalpronomen gibt es je eine Subjekt- und eine Objektform. Subjektpronomen vertreten das Subjekt des Satzes (*Wer?/Was?*).

– **He** helped me. – Do **you** remember?

Objektpronomen stehen für Dativobjekte (*Wem?*) oder Akkusativobjekte (*Wen?/Was?*)

– I don't know **them**. – He gave it to **her**.
